## What is The Royal Conservatory Certificate Program?

The Certificate Program is a well-rounded and effectively sequenced system of music study and assessment that motivates students, helps them set and achieve goals, and instills a sense of accomplishment as they complete each level.

- Available for the study of 21 different acoustic instruments, Speech Arts, and voice
- Develops overall musical literacy, increases understanding of musical language, and stylistic and structural awareness
- Includes formal examinations as an important part of the learning process at each level

## The Curriculum

The curriculum of The Royal Conservatory Certificate Program consists of ten levels (1-10), Preparatory/Introductory Levels and Professional ARCT designations.

- Each level includes repertoire, etudes or vocalises, technical tests, ear tests, sight reading, and orchestral excerpts for string, brass, and wind instruments
- Repertoire includes pieces from all style periods: Baroque, Classical, Romantic, and Contemporary
- Students progress at their own pace and move freely through the system
- Development of overall musical literacy is assured through the inclusion of music theory (rudiments, harmony and analysis) and music history at each level
